



Prepare the Way: The Perfect Gift -- Isaiah 40

Where have you seen hope recently? We see hope in the faces of each of us gathered here in worship. We feel hope through signs of mercy and grace shown to those in our communities during this busy season. We show hope through acts of loving kindness. We know of hope in the face of a child or an elder whom we love and trust. We trust in the hope of the Christ Child, for whom we prepare a way so he can prepare a way for us to know the fullness of God's love.

There is hope all around us while we wait during this season of Advent.

Every year, the Christmas Joy Offering, one of the four churchwide Special Offerings of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), combines thousands of congregations' gifts to bring hope through education and emergency assistance.

Decorating the Church for Christmas



Many churches invite their members to help prepare the church for Advent and Christmas. Some call the event the "Hanging of the Greens." Pine or fir branches, holly, pinecones, candles, colorful cloth or ribbons, and an Advent wreath are used for decorations. A tree with Chrismons hanging on it is often placed somewhere in the sanctuary. Some churches add a new decoration to the sanctuary every week during the season.

The custom of displaying a Nativity scene in the chancel dates from the early 1600s. The tradition started in Germany.

It is thought that the first Nativity scene – in which live animals and people representing shepherds and wise men gathered at an outdoor manger – began with St. Francis of Assisi around the year 1220.

The Light of Life

Most sand comes from coral and rocks that get ground into tiny grains. But in a few places, like some beaches of Japan, the bits of sand are shells or skeletons that once housed single-celled organisms. A magnifying glass reveals their star shape: a rounded middle and five or more spines, like a sea star.

These unique creatures live on undersea reefs and share their interior with algae called diatoms, which convert light into carbohydrates and oxygen through photosynthesis. The star points let light into the exoskeleton; in turn, diatoms produce energy to feed them both. When these organisms die, the star skeletons wash onto beaches, protecting the islands even after their own lives end. Our amazing God designed astounding creatures!

This same Creator made us able to take in light from Christ. Jesus said, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me ... will have the light of life" (John 8:12). When we receive his light, it becomes in us the "energy" we need to do good: to love others, care for people in need, appreciate nature — including star sand! — and give glory to the Artist of this entire incredible world.

NUTURING FAITH IDEAS from the Presbytery of WV

Please use these suggested scriptures, questions, and activities to help you explore your faith.

December 1 - First Sunday of Advent: Read Luke 21:25-36

As we enter this Advent Season, our Scripture passage speaks of signs of the coming of the Son of Man in a cloud with power and glory. How do you visualize this scene depicted in the Scripture passage? Draw a picture with your family to depict His coming?

December 8 - Second Sunday of Advent: Read Luke 3:1-6

As John the Baptist was sent to prepare the way for Jesus, so must we prepare ourselves for Jesus. This is a time of hope and preparation. During Advent, reflect on what preparations you are making in your life and in your heart for the coming of Jesus. The way must be prepared in your heart for Jesus' coming; only then will you see the true salvation of God.

December 15 - Third Sunday of Advent: Read Isaiah 12:2-6

December is a wonderful time of year, but it is also a very busy time with shopping to do, presents to wrap, trees to decorate, and more. During all this, we must remember, first and foremost, that Jesus, the Son of God, is coming soon to bring joy and salvation into this world!!! Salvation is the gift for all of us!!! So, despite all the other distractions of this season, remember to put the coming birth of the Savior at the top of your priority lest.

December 22 – Fourth Sunday of Advent: Read Luke 39-45

When Mary greets Elizabeth, her unborn child recognizes that Mary is pregnant with Jesus and leaps for joy in her womb. Do you know Jesus? Do you recognize when Jesus enters your presence and, if so, do you leap for joy? Jesus was sent because God loves each of us and God's mission is to bring hope and salvation to a troubled world. Take some time and reflect on our world and how Jesus gives you hope even during our bleakest moments.

December 29 - First Sunday of Christmas: Read Colossians 3:12-17

Christmas is here. Christ has come!!! Now we must take the time to think about what that means: to love one another; to forgive; to be compassionate, kind, and faithful, in short, to live our lives following the example Jesus set to the best of our abilities. So, this Christmas, put away old grudges, forgive those who have wronged you, be compassionate and kind to all, especially those less fortunate, and remember to always give thanks to God through Jesus for all these gifts this Christmas!









Puzzle!
