QUICK FACTS:

- Since 1940, World Communion Sunday is an ecumenical celebration of our oneness in the Spirit and the Gospel of Jesus Christ, bringing churches together in Christian unity.
- This year marks the 40th anniversary of *Peacemaking: The Believers Calling* approved by the 192nd General Assembly (1980).
- World Communion Sunday (October 6) is the most common Sunday fo0r receiving the Offering, but many congregations promote the Offering throughout A Season of Peace (September 8 – October 6).
- 25% of the Offering stays with local congregations, and 25% with mid councils to unite congregations to support peacemaking in their regions.
- 50% of this Offering supports the work for peace and reconciliation being done by Presbyterians across the globe.



- While making eyes, pray, "Open my eyes to see the beauty you've made in the world around me." (*Read Psalm 104:24.*)
- While making the nose, pray, "I'm sorry for the times I've turned up my nose at your many gifts." (*Read James 1:17.*)
- While making the mouth, pray, "Let everything I say please you." (*Read Psalm 19:14.*)
- While lighting the candle, pray, "Lord, help me shine your light to others through the things I do." (*Read Matthew 5:16.*)
- Display your carved pumpkins as examples of how God's love transforms us into new creations. (*Read 2 Corinthians 5:17.*)

NUTURING FAITH IDEAS from the Presbytery of WV

Please use these suggested scriptures, questions, and activities to help you explore your faith.

October 6 – Nineteenth Sunday after Pentecost: Read Mark 10:2-16

Jesus told the disciples that whoever does not receive the kingdom as a little child will never enter it. We must disregard our goals of fame and fortune and turn to God as powerless children. How do you need to change your thinking to make this happen?

October 13 – Twentieth Sunday after Pentecost: Read Mark 10:17-31

It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God. Wealth and honor will not get you into the kingdom. How do you prioritize your need for wealth and your desire to enter the kingdom of God?

October 20 – Twenty-First Sunday after Pentecost: Read Job 38:1-7

Job has suffered greatly, and his friends give advice. Elihu puts Job in his place, so to speak, declaring his unworthiness to question God. God's response is a rebuke to Elihu and friends who speak without knowledge. Job, in his anguish, yells at God; do you ever do the same? How does God respond?

October 27 – Twenty-Second Sunday after Pentecost: Read Mark 10:46-52

Jesus heals Bartimaeus' eyesight because of the faith with which he shouted out to Jesus, and he becomes a follower of Jesus. Bartimaeus did not fear the rebukes of the disciples but continued to call out in faith. How can you and your family work to strengthen your faith considering your trials and suffering so you can call upon Jesus for help?



Total Immersion

In college, I took an American Sign Language class from a Deaf instructor who couldn't speak. On the first day, another staff member explained that we'd be experiencing total immersion. She left, and the classroom remained silently engaged for the rest of the semester.

Creatively, the instructor began by writing "same" and "different" on the whiteboard and demonstrating those signs. Then he took us through several examples where we were to use the signs to identify what was the same or different. That's how he taught ASL, graciously guiding us without audible voices. We embraced a brand-new approach to communicating.

The church can do that too. We can use "all that is within" us to praise God's holy name (Psalm 103:1). We can get creative and harness everything — all our senses — to worship.

This might mean removing distractions, learning a new style of music, using visual arts or engaging with a different culture — all while offering praise. Instead of feeling bound by what's familiar and comfortable, try to be immersed and all-in while worshiping the Lord!

- Permanent marker


What you do:
